PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION

Masses at 5:00 pm (Saturday); 7:30, 9:00, 11:00 am & 6:00 pm (Sunday) Holy Week begins with the waving of palms as we welcome Jesus into Jerusalem. We read the Lord's Passion at all Masses and blessed palms are distributed as we begin this most sacred week in our liturgical calendar.



7:00 PM BOLD TNL SEDER MEAL

All high schoolers are invited to join us for a Seder Meal. It is a ritual meal served on the first night of Passover, commemorating the flight of the Jews from Egypt. Jesus instituted the Eucharist during the Last Supper when he was celebrating the Passover Meal with his disciples.

7:30 PM TENEBRAE – MUSIC & MEDITATION

Tenebrae means darkness or shadows. As we come to the end of Lent, we begin a journey into darkness to a place of deep shadows. As Scripture readings and hymns are shared to tell the story of Holy Week, we accompany Jesus in his last hours and extinguish seven candles until the church will be filled with darkness. This gradual darkness symbolizes Jesus' increasing sorrows as the events of Passion Week progress.

LIVE LENT! SMALL GROUPS**

Gather weekly in an in-home small group and get inspired by the Sunday Gospel readings. Reflect and pray, take action in everyday life, and partake in fellowship. STATIONS OF THE CROSS - FRIDAY NIGHTS

FEBRUARY 16, 23, MARCH 1, 8, 15, 22 Every Friday at 7:00 pm. Also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, this commemorates Jesus' passion and death on the cross. There are 14 stations that each depict a moment on his journey to Calvary.

HOLY THURSDAY

8:30 AM MORNING PRAYER

HOLY TRIDUUM

Come and pray the Liturgy of the Hours, the prayer of the whole Universal Church. It is an ancient, structured way of praying Scripture throughout the day, focusing especially on the Psalms. This beautiful prayer sets the rhythm of our lives and gives us a great source of nourishment as we meditate on the history of our salvation.

7:30 PM MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER (LIVESTREAMED)

The Mass of the Lord's Supper celebrates the institution of the Eucharist and Priesthood, and demonstrates the importance of service shown to us by Christ in the washing of the feet. The liturgy begins the Holy Triduum and is concluded with the Blessed Sacrament being moved to the altar of repose, representing the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus prayed before he was arrested.

GOOD FRIDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION 8:30 AM MORNING PRAYER

Come and pray the Liturgy of the Hours, as we meditate on the history of our salvation, especially the redemptive suffering of Jesus on the Cross.

3:00 PM LITURGY OF THE LORD'S PASSION (LIVESTREAMED)

On Good Friday, the Church celebrates the redemptive death of Jesus on the Cross. We meditate on the Lord's Passion and Jesus' Cross is venerated during the liturgy as we pray for the needs of the whole world.

7:30 PM STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross are prayed on the evening of Christ's death. We solemnly journey with Christ through His passion and death.

HOLY SATURDAY

11:00 AM BLESSING OF EASTER BASKETS

A simple tradition where parishioners bring their Easter baskets to be blessed. May the blessings of the Resurrection bring joy and hope into our lives and homes.

12:30 PM EASTER EGG HUNT

Easter is on the way! Join us for an egg hunt where we'll have fun and play! See how many you can find as we celebrate this special day!

8:00 PM EASTER VIGIL MASS (LIVESTREAMED) On this holy night, the Church keeps watch, celebrating the

Resurrection of Christ, and awaiting His return in glory. It is the turning point of the Holy Triduum, the Passover of the new covenant, which marks Christ's passage from death to life. This is the most sacred and beautiful liturgy of the Church year.

EASTER SUNDAY – THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

Christ is risen! Alleluia! Celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Resurrection and the triumph of Christ over death.
